Hampshire Hospital

Hampshire Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust is refreshing its five-year strategy to set out how it will deliver care, support staff, and work with partners.

Feedback will inform decision-making and priority setting for Hampshire Hospitals, with the final strategy due to be published in the winter.

Business Grants

We have previously reported that government money has been drying up in many areas for local grants, however, it would appear there are still some funds to be distributed, and Winchester district businesses are invited to make use of the package of support launched for becoming more sustainable. This includes a free carbon assessment undertaken by

Winchester-based environmental consultants <u>Arthian</u> and the chance to apply to the latest round of green business grants.

The carbon assessments support businesses to reduce their environmental impact and costs by suggesting quick wins and longer-term projects. Businesses that take part will then be able to use their carbon reduction plan when applying for funding through the green business grants.

The grants are designed to help businesses reduce their energy consumption and transport costs and switch to renewable energy. The grant can cover up to 50% of the project costs, amounting to between £2,000 and £5,000.
